## CHIPMUNK

*The de Havilland Canada DHC-1 Chipmunk is a tandem, two-seat, single engine primary trainer aircraft which was the standard trainer for the Royal Canadian Air Force throughout much of the post-second World War years. Over 500 DHC-1 Chipmunk (affectionately known as "Chippie") airframes remain airworthy.*



## STEARMAN

*The Stearman Aircraft Corporation, founded in 1927, is most known for producing the Model 75, which is commonly known simply as the "Stearman". In 1934, Stearman was made a subsidiary of Boeing. The Kaydet would become the primary trainer aircraft for the US military during World War II.*



## HARVARD

*The AT-6 was a high-performance trainer with more power and retractable landing gear. It became the main advanced trainer for all of the U.S. and British services during World War II, with production continuing after the war. The plane was built under license by Canadian Car & Foundry in Fort William, Ont.*
